Since its inception over eight years ago the Foundation's mission has been to help all children regardless of their ability to pay.

The Foundation supports our eye clinic for underprivileged children. Over 9,000 patient visits and 800 surgeries have been provided by the clinic since the Wright Foundation was founded. We also provide glasses and therapeutic contact lenses for children whose families cannot afford them. Our motto is that no child is turned away because of their inability to pay.

The Wright Foundation also supports education in pediatric ophthalmology and strabismus. We host seminars for local and regional physicians every year providing updates on latest information. The Foundation supports our AAPOS-approved fellowship training program. Over the last 8 years we have trained over 50 fellows and residents from the USA and around the world in pediatric ophthalmology and strabismus.

Research in pediatric ophthalmology is an important function of our foundation. An example is our publication in the Journal Pediatrics which is now sited as having saved the sight in literally hundreds of premature infants around the world. Our published protocol is now considered standard of care in the US and worldwide.
